

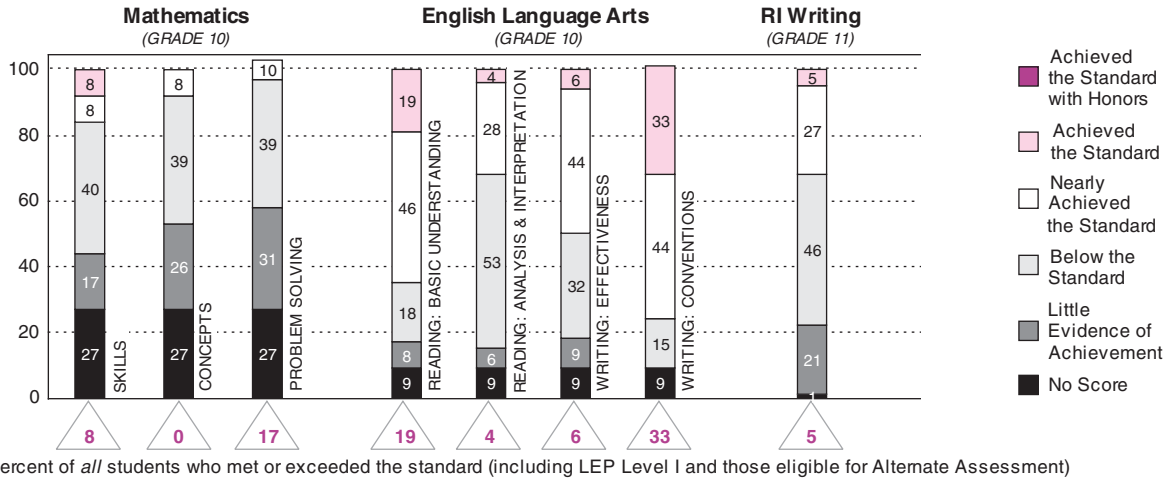

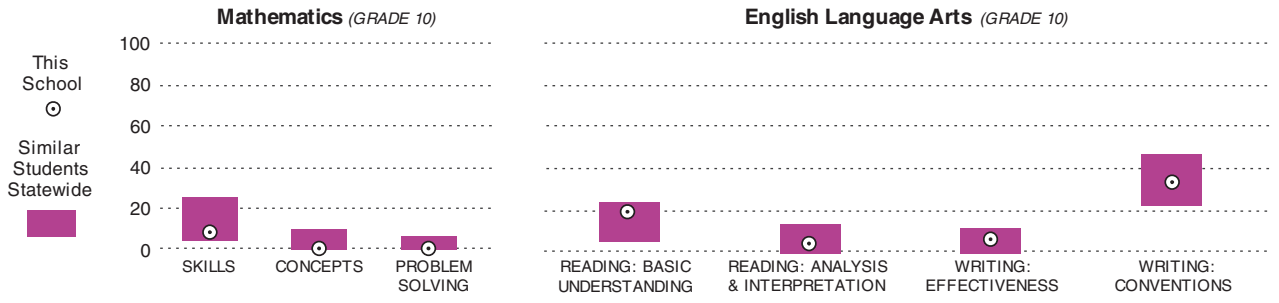

Percentage of eligible students at each performance level on the high school assessments

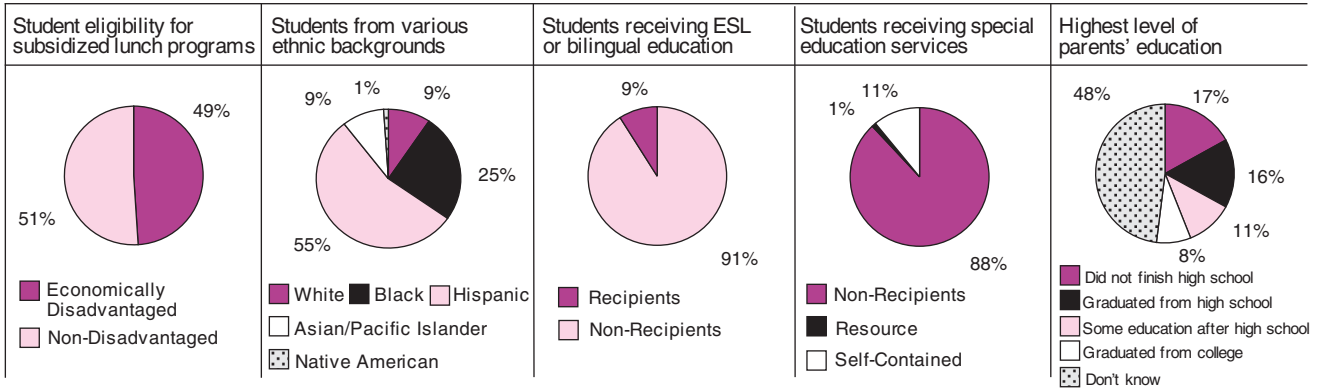

Percentage of eligible students in this school who met or exceeded the standard compared to the percentage of similar students statewide

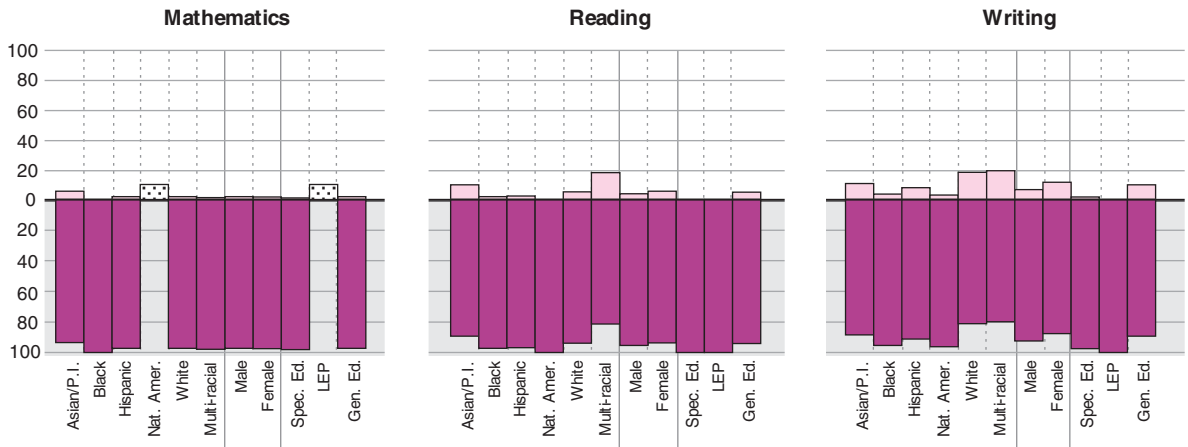


Characteristics of students attending this school

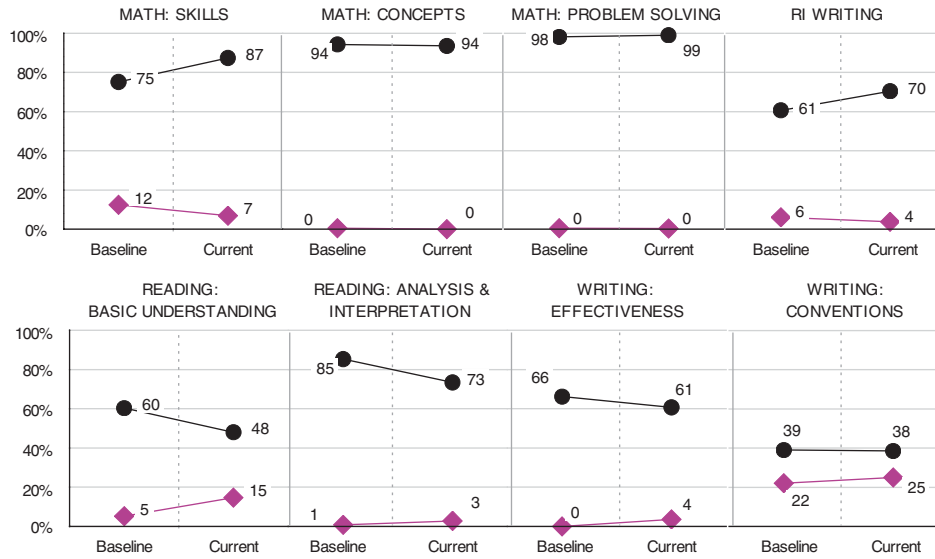

Performance progress

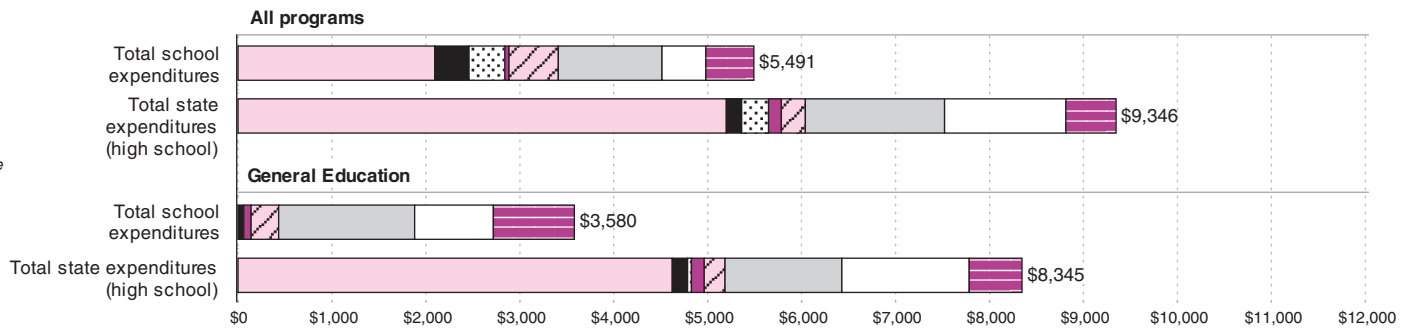
- Percent of students in lowest performance levels

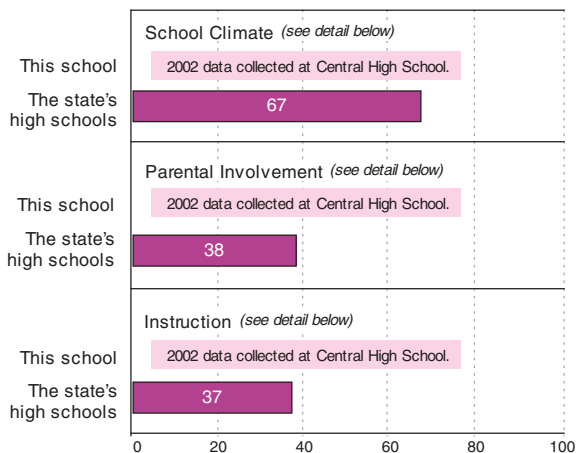

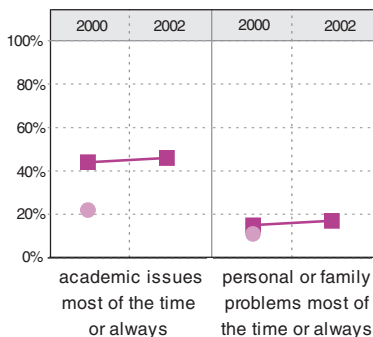

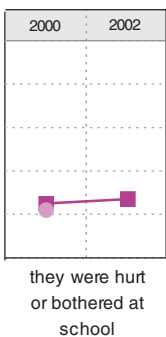

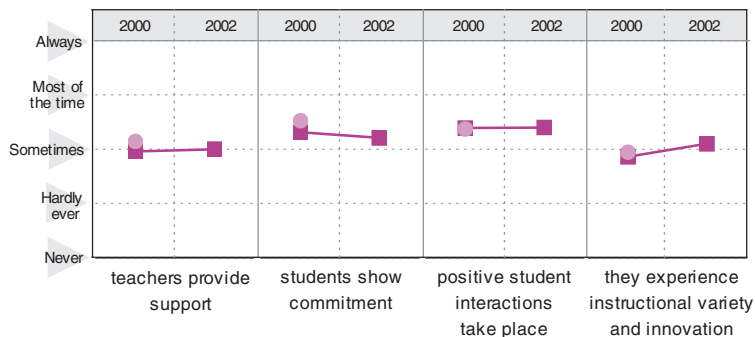
Percent of students reporting that they feel they can talk to a teacher or other staff member about . . .

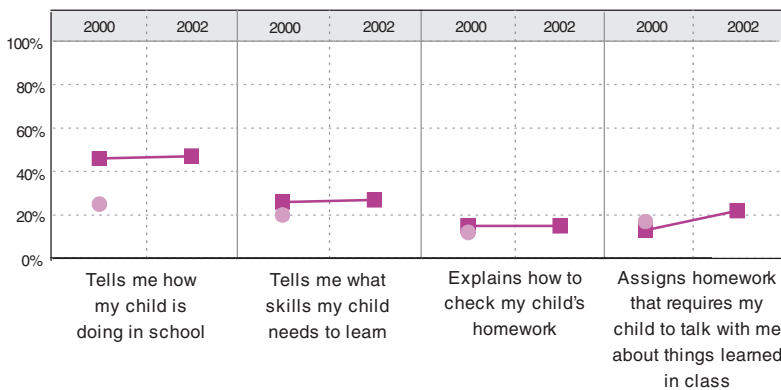

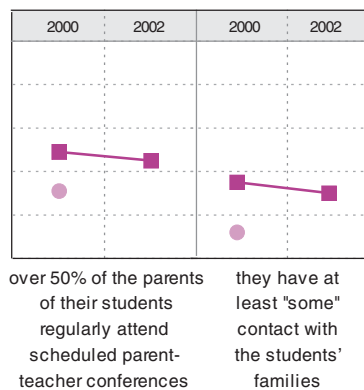

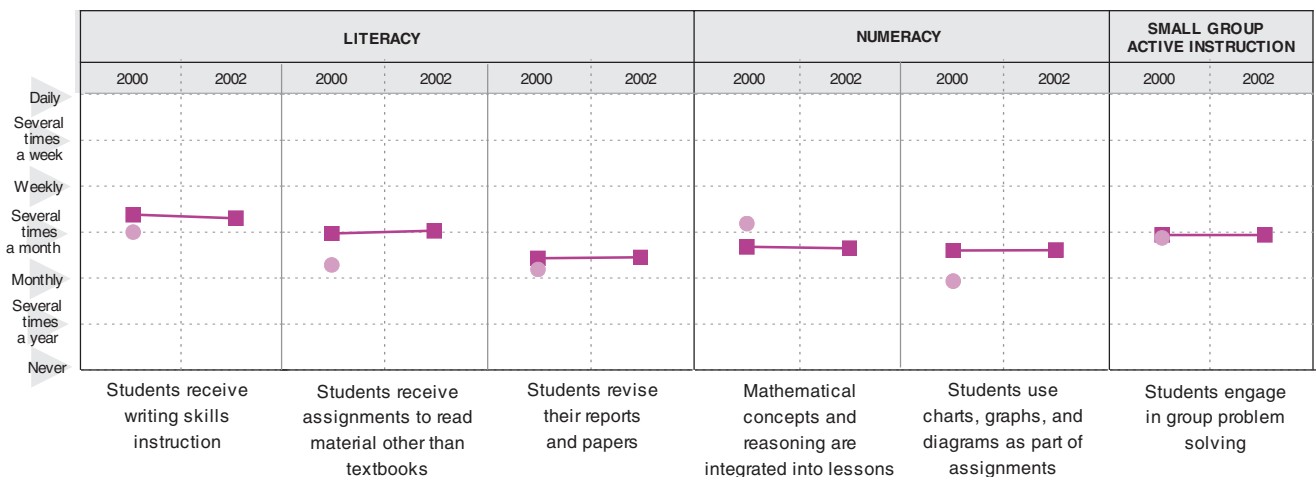
