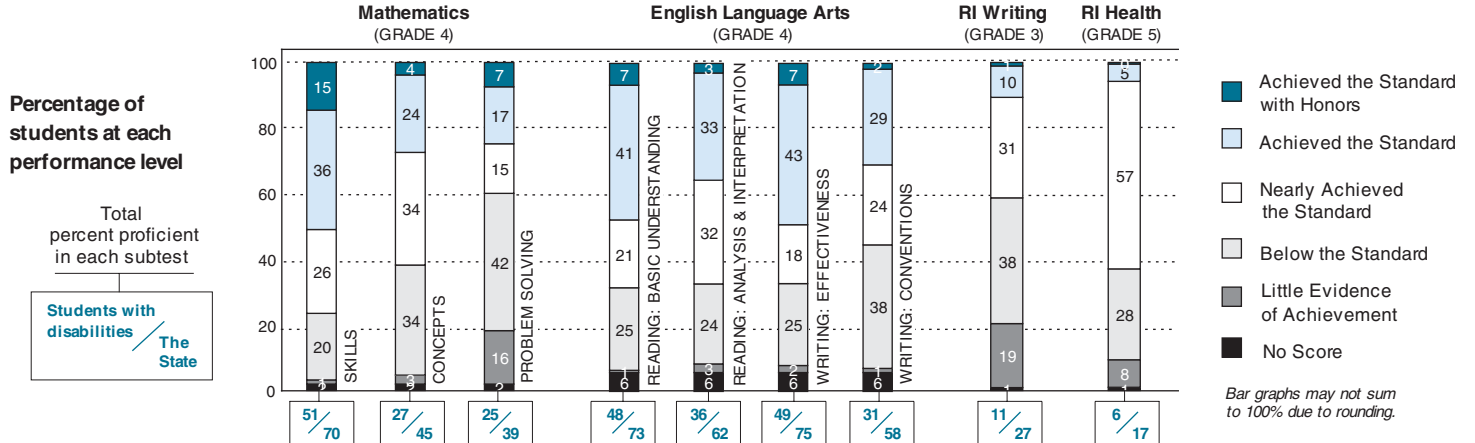


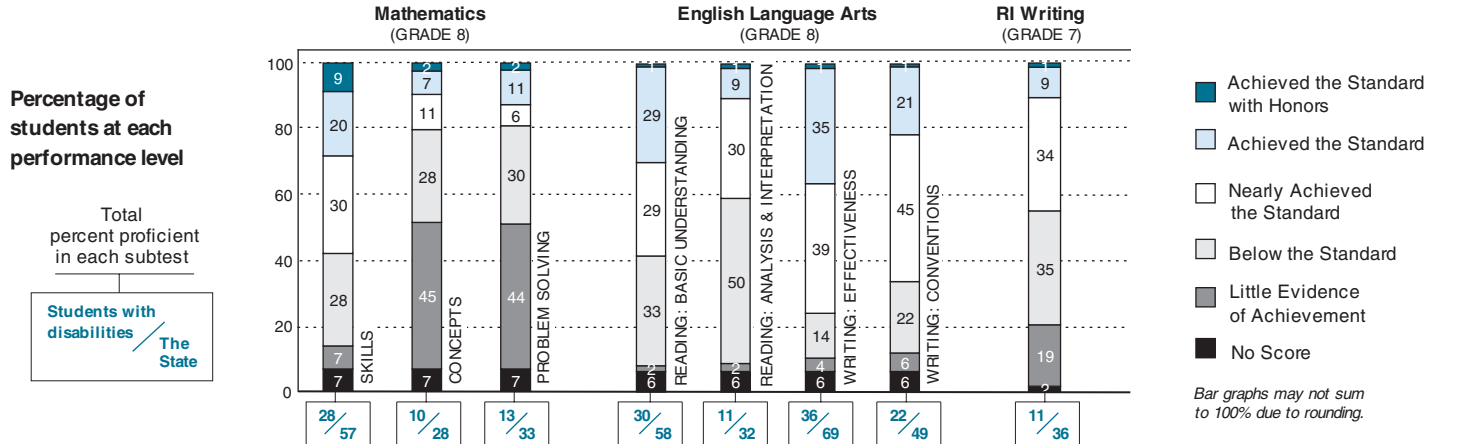

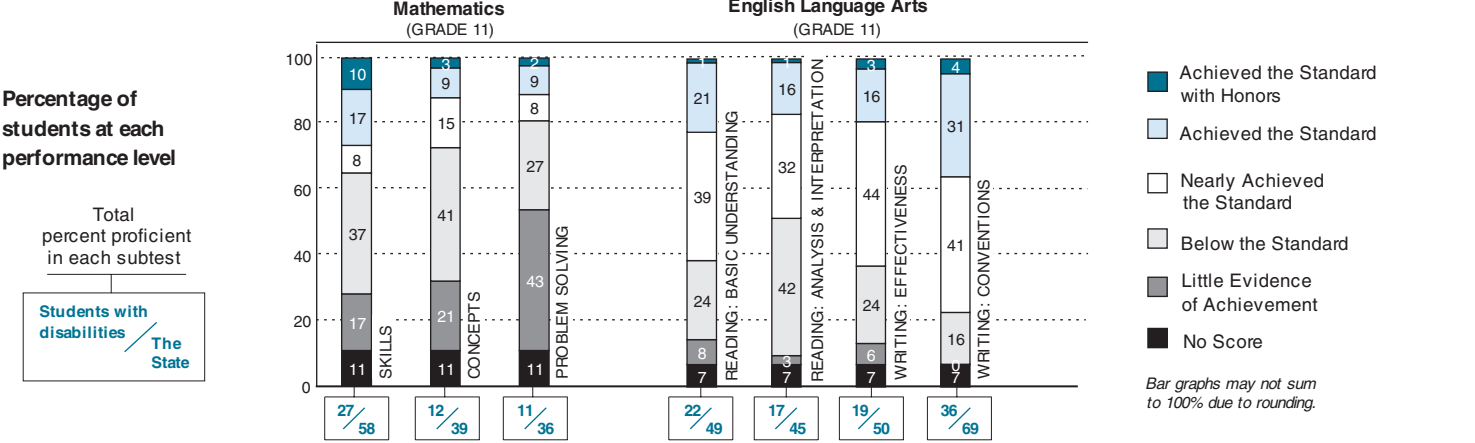

 Students with disabilities



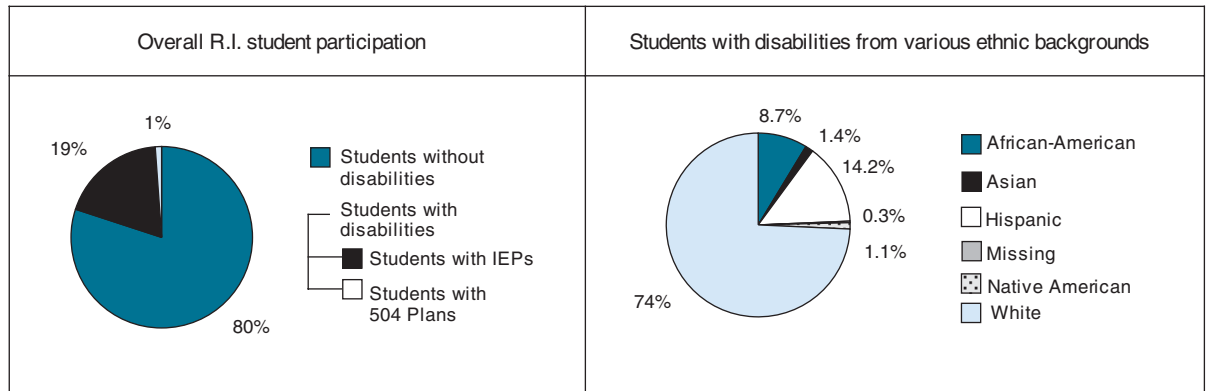
2004 Assessment Results: Middle Schools
 Students with disabilities



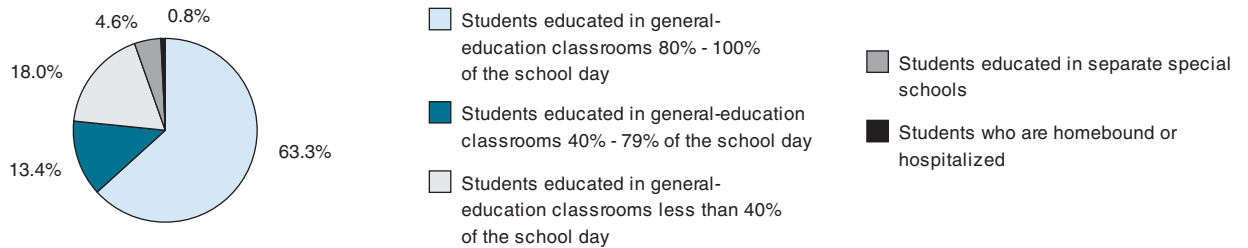

Inclusion: Educating students with disabilities in the least restrictive environment



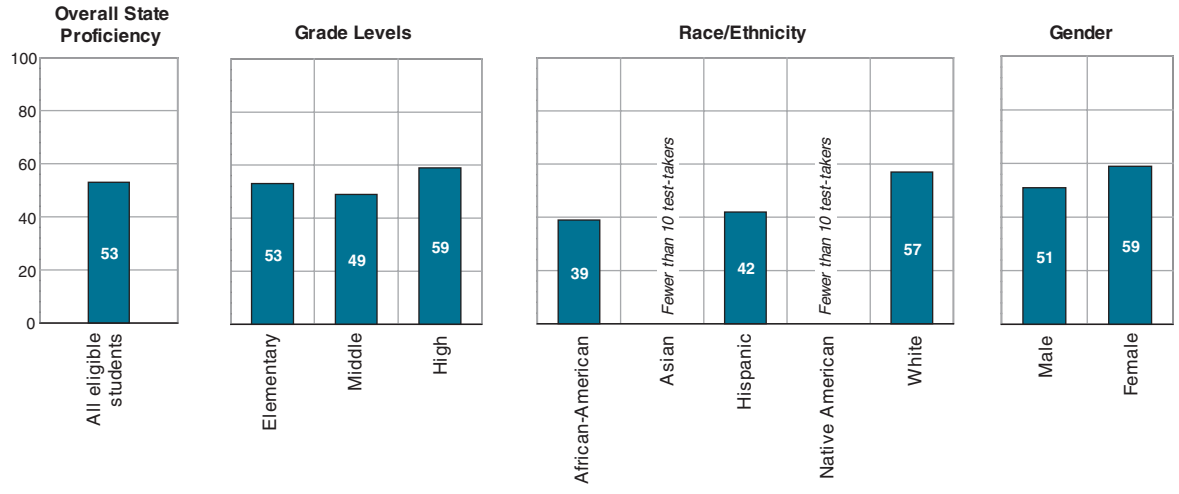

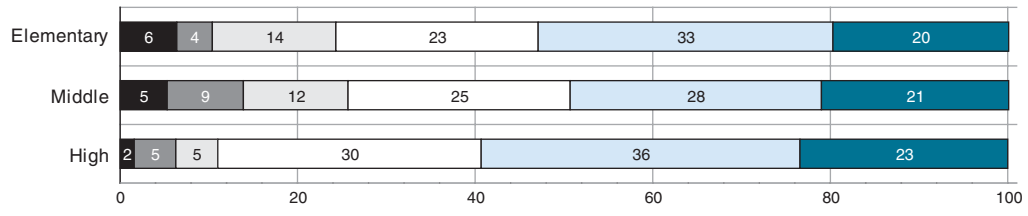
Alternate Assessment performance in the State of Rhode Island

Percent of students achieving the standard on the Alternate Assessment



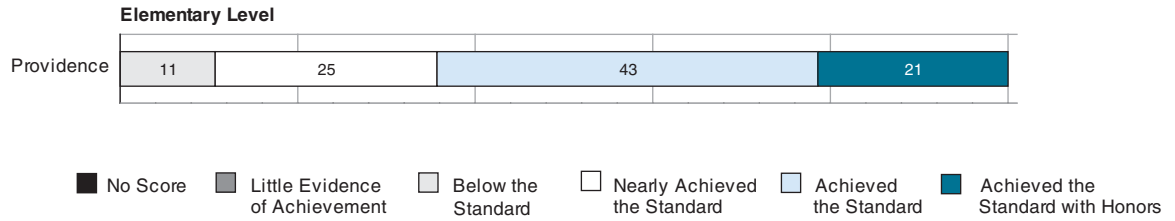
Percent of students at each performance level on the Alternate Assessment
