



**Highly qualified teachers**

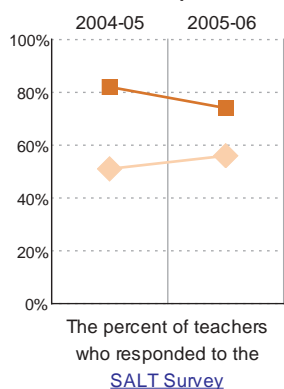

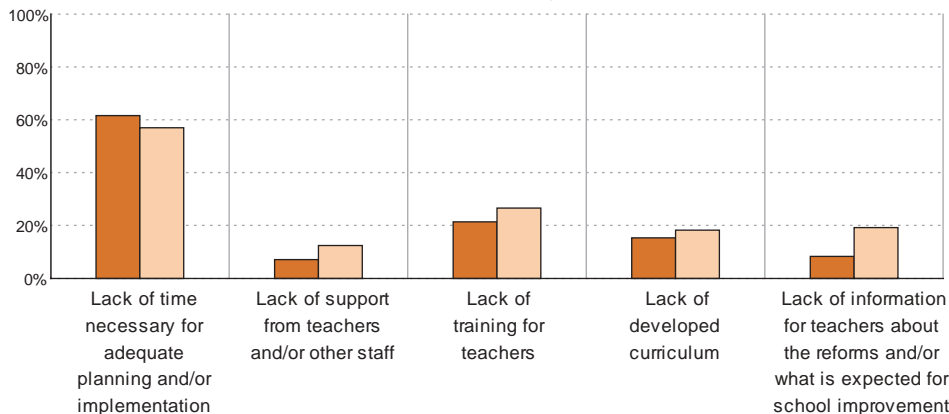

Percent of teachers who say they agree or strongly agree that:

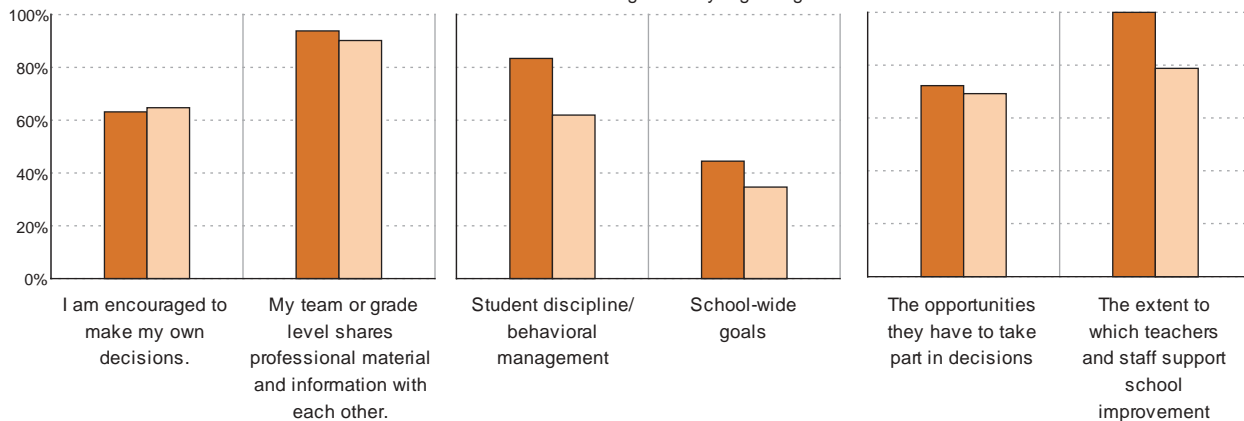
Percent of teachers who say that their team or grade level has much or very much decision-making authority regarding:
