



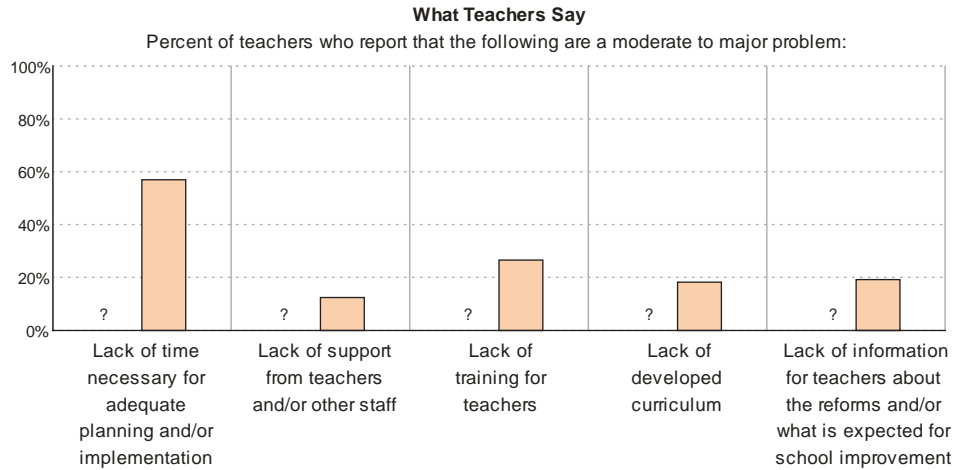
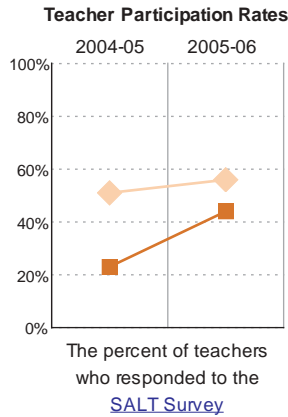
**Highly qualified teachers**

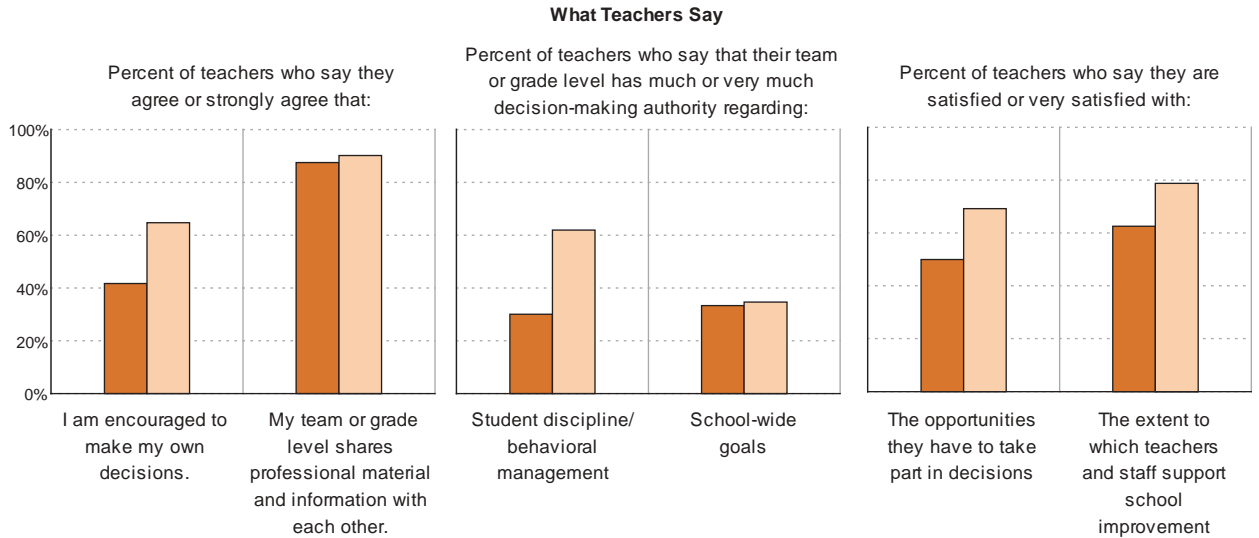
