

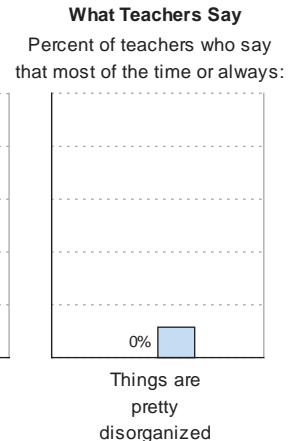
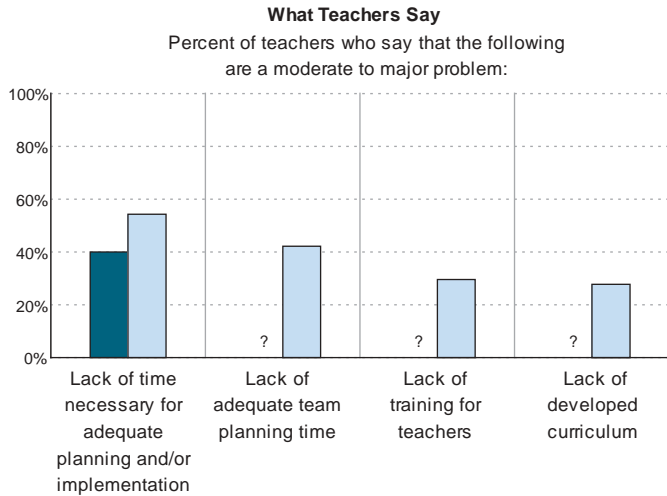
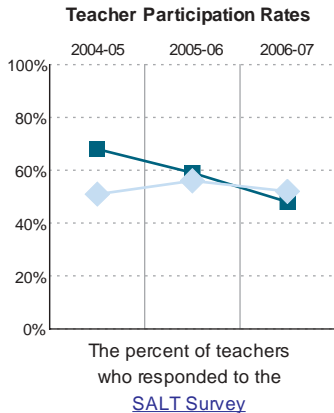


Highly qualified teachers

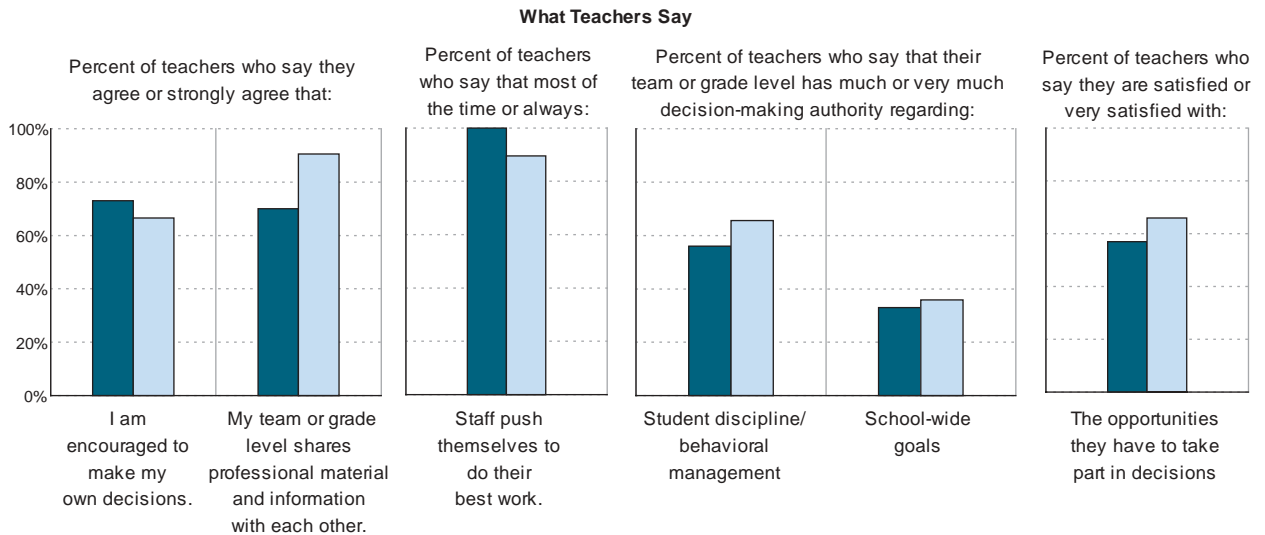
