



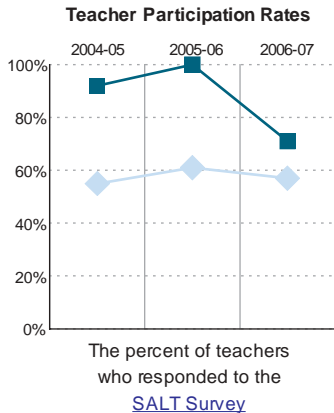
Highly qualified teachers

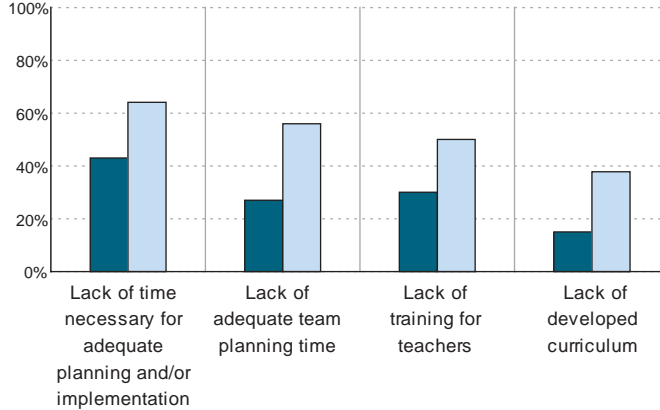

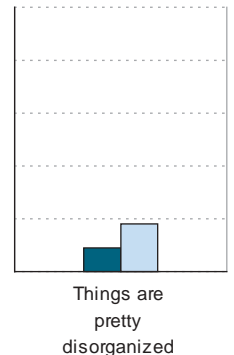
What Teachers Say

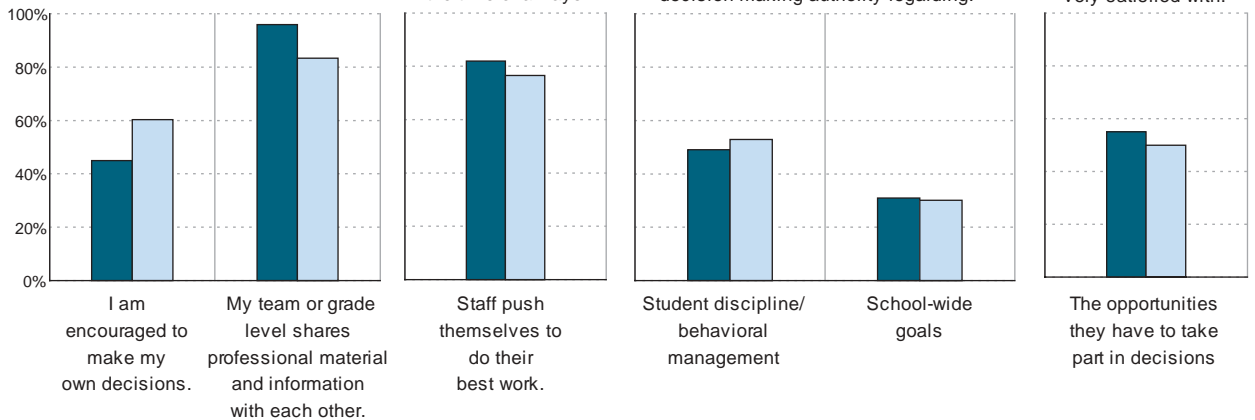
